

Welcome to KANGAROO ISLAND

Kangaroo Island is Australia's third-largest island, so it's recommended to stay for at least two or three nights to truly experience this remarkable place.



HOW TO GET THERE:

- 30 minutes flight from Adelaide to Kingscote Airport.
- 1.5 hour drive from Adelaide to Cape Jervis ferry terminal, plus a 45 minute ferry ride to Penneshaw.

HOW TO EXPLORE:

Coach or private tour. Self-drive is possible, but we recommend booking small group 4x4 or coach touring. There is no public transport or taxi service on Kangaroo Island.

WHEN TO VISIT:

December to February (Summer)

Ideal for exploring the island's stunning beaches.

March to May (Autumn)

Perfect for spotting wildlife, identifying birds and bushwalking.

June to August (Winter)

Joeys emerge from their mother's pouch to explore, and southern right whales cruise the coastline.

September to November (Spring)

Enjoy wildflowers in full bloom and the abundant wildlife that comes out to play.

EYRE PENINSULA

MURRAY RIVER

Explore Australia's greatest waterway, only a 3 hour drive via the wineries of the Barossa to Renmark. Towering ochre cliffs, winding channels and vast open skies create a landscape made for exploring. Drift, paddle, cruise or simply sit back and let the river set the pace. Around 130 million years old, the Murray is rich in Aboriginal history and alive with wildlife and birdlife. As night falls, the River Murray International Dark Sky Reserve offers some of the clearest, star-filled skies in the world.

FLINDERS RANGES & OUTBACK

A true Outback experience where towering ancient mountain ranges and gorges border dusty red roads, just a 5 hour drive from Adelaide. SOUTHERN OCEAN DRIVE/LIMESTONE COAST

The Limestone Coast is home to some of South Australia's most spectacular natural wonders, sumptuous wine and fresh produce. Here, soft limestone has been carved into caves and sinkholes, cliffs have been worn by the Southern Ocean and the rich red soil has spent centuries preparing itself for the vines that now stretch as far as the eye can see. Break up the drive from Adelaide to Melbourne with at least two nights along this incredible stretch of coastline.
